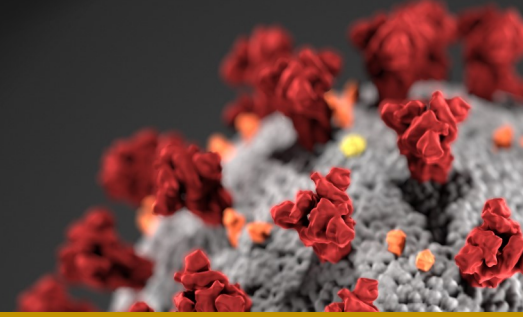


COVID-19 ADVISORY & GUIDANCE UPDATE

This update summarizes news, guidance, advisories, and legislative and executive actions taken by federal, state and local governments that impact San Bernardino County and its response to the Novel Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) crisis.

A. **March 19** — Governor Newsom issued [Executive Order N-33-20](#). As a result of the order, the California State Public Health Officer and the Director of the California Department of Public Health, have ordered all individuals living in the State of California to stay home or at their place of residence, except for those individuals working in critical functions that are identified by the federal government. See below item B for more information.

This is necessary to reduce the spread of the Coronavirus, and the impacts of the COVID-19 disease. Californians will continue to have access to necessities such as gas, food, prescriptions, healthcare and banks. Social distancing practices must be adhered to at all times. This statewide order will remain in effect until further notice.

B. **March 19** — The U.S. Department of Homeland Security identified and discussed [Essential Critical Infrastructure Workers](#) that provide health and safety functions and those who focus on the well-being of the community. The guidelines are intended to support the state, local, and industry partners in identifying critical infrastructure, and workers Americans depend on daily to operate resiliently during the COVID-19 pandemic including:

- Government agencies
- National security functions
- Energy and utilities
- Supply chains
- Communications
- Medical systems
- Banks and financial institutions
- Food supply
- Pharmacies
