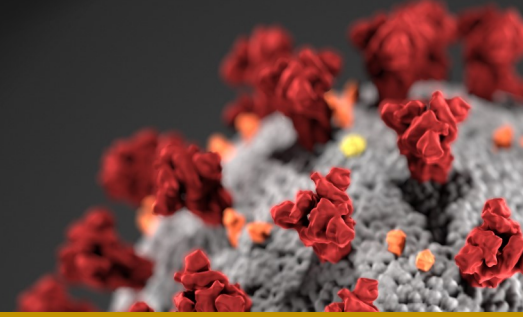


# COVID-19 ADVISORY & GUIDANCE UPDATE

This update summarizes news, guidance, advisories, and legislative and executive actions taken by federal, state and local governments that impact San Bernardino County and its response to the Novel Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) crisis.

- **April 14** — Governor Newsom announced:
  - Six key indicators to be considered before modifying the stay-at-home order and other COVID-19 interventions. These indicators are the ability:
    - ◇ To monitor and protect our communities through testing, contact tracing, isolation and supporting those who are positive or exposed;
    - ◇ To prevent infection in people who are at risk for more severe COVID-19;
    - ◇ Of the hospital and health systems to handle surges;
    - ◇ To develop therapeutics to meet the demand;
    - ◇ For businesses, schools and child care facilities to support physical distancing;
    - ◇ To determine when to reinstitute certain measures, such as stay-at-home orders, if necessary.
  - An executive order to address the release and reentry process at the Division of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) in response to COVID-19 so that eligible youth serving time at DJJ can be discharged safely and expeditiously.
- **April 14** — The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention released recommendations for cleaning and decontaminating non-emergency transport vehicles that may have transported passengers with suspected or confirmed COVID-19.
