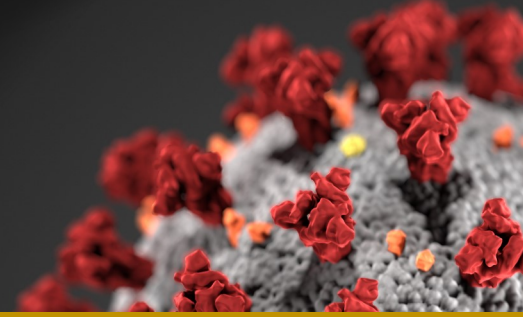


COVID-19 ADVISORY & GUIDANCE UPDATE

This update summarizes news, guidance, advisories, and legislative and executive actions taken by federal, state and local governments that impact San Bernardino County and its response to the Novel Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) crisis.

- April 26 — the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) issued [interim guidance for the meat and poultry packing industry](#).
- April 24 — Governor Newsom announced [programs to support older Californians](#) which includes:
 - First-in-the-nation program to partner with local restaurants to provide meals.
 - Social bridging project to make wellness check in calls.
 - Friendship line to provide emotional support.
- April 23 — Governor Newsom signed executive orders:
 - [Addressing a variety of issues in response to COVID-19](#) including:
 - Granting a 60-day extension for customers on several Department of Motor Vehicle deadlines, including recently expired drivers' licenses and ID cards.
 - Suspends late fees from being applied for expired vehicle registration.
 - Allows certain posting, filing and notice requirements to be satisfied electronically.
 - Temporarily allows retailer to provide bags to customers without charge and pauses redemption of beverage containers in-store.
 - Suspends the requirement for recycling centers to hold a minimum number of hours of operation and directs the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery to develop and issue operating guidelines.
 - [Providing flexibility to Medi-Cal providers and the Department of Health Care Services](#) on a variety of deadlines and requirements to ensure continuity of services.
 - [Empowering schools](#) to focus on COVID-19 response and transparency.
