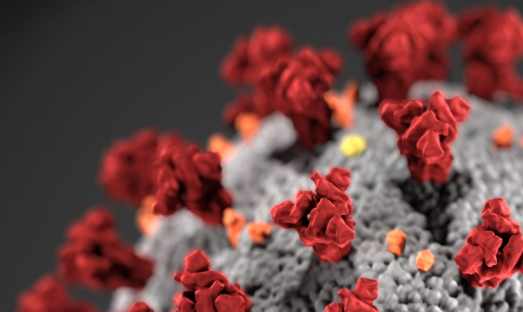


COVID-19 ADVISORY & GUIDANCE UPDATE

This update summarizes news, guidance, advisories, and legislative and executive actions taken by federal, state and local governments that impact San Bernardino County and its response to the Novel Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) crisis.

- **May 12** - the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) issued:

- **May 12** - [FEMA issued an exercise starter kit with sample documents](#) for organizations planning to resume operations.
- **May 12** - California Department of Public Health (CDPH) [announced new sectors that can reopen with modifications statewide.](#)
- **May 12** - [Governor Newsom, announced](#) that over 1 million diagnostic tests have been conducted and the state's testing capacity will continue to be increased. To assist the increase, the [California Department of Consumer Affairs and State Board of Pharmacy](#) will allow pharmacists to collect specimen samples and order tests for consumers. The specimens will be delivered and processed at public health, university or commercial labs.
- **May 12** - The County announced that [public testing locations for COVID-19 are open to any resident](#), regardless of whether any symptoms are present to be tested. Appointments are still required.
