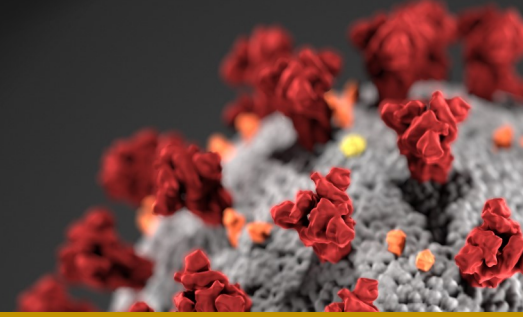


# COVID-19 ADVISORY & GUIDANCE UPDATE

This update summarizes news, guidance, advisories, and legislative and executive actions taken by federal, state and local governments that impact San Bernardino County and its response to the Novel Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) crisis.

- **May 19** - The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) released information on:
  - [Protecting yourself and others from COVID-19 when visiting parks and recreation facilities.](#)

- **May 19** - The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) issued an [updated interim enforcement response plan for COVID-19.](#)
- **May 19** - [Governor Newsom issued an executive order](#) addressing a variety of issues in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- **May 18** - The [U.S. Department of Health and Human Services \(HSS\)](#) announced \$11 billion in new funding to support COVID-19 testing.
- **May 18** - The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid services (CMS) issued [recommendations for reopening nursing homes.](#)
- **May 18** - The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) issued:

- **May 18** - [San Bernardino County announced the Skilled Nursing Facility + Outreach Support Team, or SO+S,](#) which is a specialized team focused on helping skilled nursing facilities.
- **May 15** - The [U.S. Department of Agriculture \(USDA\)](#) announced the extension of waivers giving child nutrition program operators the ability to continue feeding children through the summer while promoting social distancing and keeping families safe during the COVID-19 pandemic.
