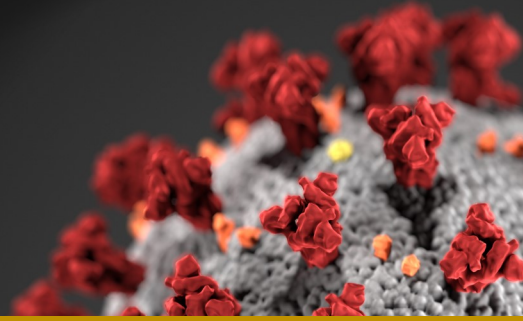


COVID-19 ADVISORY & GUIDANCE UPDATE

This update summarizes news, guidance, advisories, and legislative and executive actions taken by federal, state and local governments that impact San Bernardino County and its response to the Novel Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) crisis.

- **July 13** - Governor Newsom released [new requirements](#) for all California counties to close indoor operations in a variety of sectors.
 - Bars, brewpubs, breweries, and pubs must close all operations both indoor and outdoor statewide.
- Counties that have remained on the County Monitoring List for 3 consecutive days (including San Bernardino and Riverside Counties) will be required to shut down the following industries or activities unless they can be modified to operate outside or by pick-up:
 - Fitness centers
 - Worship services
 - Protests
 - Offices for non-essential sectors
 - Personal care services, like nail salons, body waxing and tattoo parlors
 - Hair salons and barbershops
 - Malls
