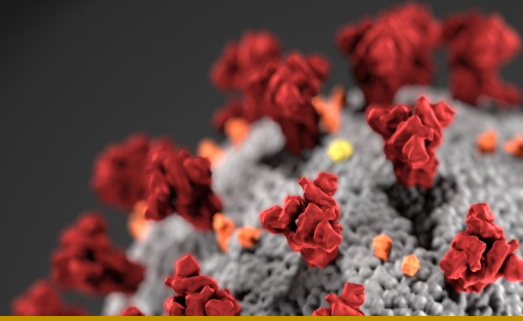


COVID-19 ADVISORY & GUIDANCE UPDATE

This update summarizes news, guidance, advisories, and legislative and executive actions taken by federal, state and local governments that impact San Bernardino County and its response to the Novel Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) crisis.

- **July 23** - The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) provided updated guidance on:
 - [Personal and Social Activities](#) - Recommendations on protection practices for personal/social activities: dining at a restaurant, hosting gatherings or cook outs, attending an event or gathering, using gyms or fitness centers, going to a nail salon, visiting a library, traveling overnight and visiting parks.
 - [Test for Current Infection](#) - Includes Self-Checker: A guide to help make decisions and seek appropriate medical care.
 - [Considerations for Retirement Communities and Independent Living Facilities](#) - CDC offers the following considerations for ways in which administrators of retirement communities and independent living facilities (ILFs) can help protect residents, workers, visitors and communities and slow the spread of COVID-19. These considerations are for administrators of retirement communities and ILFs that are not healthcare facilities.
 - [Interpretation of Cumulative Death Forecasts](#) - This week CDC received 26 individual national forecasts.
 - This week's national ensemble forecast predicts there will likely be between 160,000 and 175,000 total reported COVID-19 deaths by August 15th.
 - National and state-level ensemble forecasts suggest that the number of new deaths over the next 4 weeks will likely exceed the number reported over the last 4 weeks for the US overall, as well as in 25 states and 1 territory.
- **July 23** - The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) provided updated guidance on:
 - [Updated COVID - 19 Testing Guidance](#) - This guidance is an update to the interim COVID-19 testing guidance issued by CDPH on May 1, 2020. This updated guidance is intended to support public health officials, health care providers and laboratories in determining who should be tested given the current context of the COVID-19 pandemic in California.
