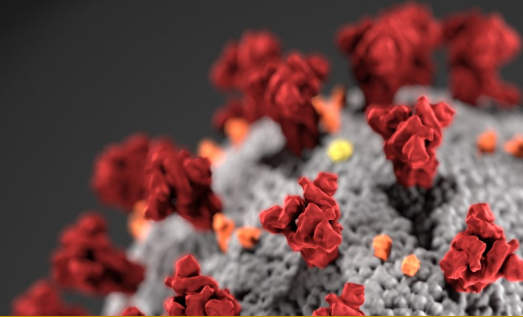


COVID-19 ADVISORY & GUIDANCE UPDATE

This update summarizes news, guidance, advisories, and legislative and executive actions taken by federal, state and local governments that impact San Bernardino County and its response to the Novel Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) crisis.

- **August 10** - The National Institutes of Health (NIH) announced the enrollment of adults at the [Clinical trials of monoclonal antibodies to prevent COVID-19](#). Monoclonal antibodies are laboratory-made version of proteins that may provide short-term protection from SARS-CoV-2 and could serve as an important component until vaccines become available. The clinical trials are enrolling healthy adults who are at risk of infection due to close contact at work or home to people with COVID-19.
- **August 10** - The United States Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) released [COVID-19 Testing Plans for July through December 2020 from all states, territories, and localities](#) on HHS.gov. The State Testing Plans serve as a roadmap for monthly testing strategies for SARS-CoV-2, including details on responding to surges in cases and reaching vulnerable populations.
- **August 10** - The Centers for Disease and Control Prevention (CDC) released updated guidance [for People Experiencing Homelessness](#).
- **August 10** - Governor Newsom announced [\\$81.8 million in commitments from private and philanthropic partners to support isolation and quarantine efforts in communities disproportionately impacted by COVID-19](#). This partnership builds on the \$286 million in grant funding from the CDC that is being made available to local governments to support their COVID-19 response efforts.
