

COVID-19 ADVISORY & GUIDANCE UPDATE

This update summarizes news, guidance, advisories, and legislative and executive actions taken by federal, state and local governments that impact San Bernardino County and its response to the Novel Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) crisis.

- **January 14** - The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) issued updated guidance on:
 - [COVID-19 Vaccines](#), including the recommendation to use V-SAFE after vaccination. V-SAFE is a smartphone-based tool that gives personalized health check-ins after receiving a COVID-19 vaccine.
 - [Winter Holidays](#), including tips on celebrating Martin Luther King Day.
- **January 14** - Governor Newsom launched [Transparency, Accountability and Assistance Measures](#) in the State's Safe Schools for All Plan. The [Safe Schools for All Hub](#) was launched as a one-stop shop for guidance and resources on safely resuming in-person instruction.
- **January 14** - San Bernardino County released a [special update](#) announcing all San Bernardino County residents ages 65 and over are now eligible to be vaccinated against COVID-19. Seniors can make appointments through sbccovid19.com/vaccine.
- **January 13** – The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) issued guidance on [Non-congregate sheltering for Individuals Experiencing Homelessness](#). It reaffirms the need for communities to provide non-congregate sheltering to protect human life and minimize strain on health care system capacity during the COVID-19 pandemic. As local governments determine how to spend newly available resources, including Project Roomkey and other funding sources, counties are advised to continue non-congregate sheltering.
