This update summarizes news, guidance, advisories, and legislative and executive actions taken by federal, state and local governments that impact San Bernardino County and its response to the Novel Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) crisis.

- **January 7** - The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) [Announced \\$22 Billion in Funding to Support Expanded Testing and Vaccination Distribution.](#)
- **January 6** - The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) issued:
 - [Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report Early Release: Allergic Reactions Including Anaphylaxis After Receipt of the First Dose of Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine—United States, December 14-23, 2020.](#)

- **January 6**– The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) issued a [Travel Advisory](#) recommending the avoidance of non-essential travel and quarantining for 10 days post-travel.
- **January 6** - San Bernardino County:
 - Introduces the [Coronavirus Quarantine and Isolation Calculator](#) that enables people to determine how long they should self-isolate after testing positive for the disease, being sick with COVID-19, or being exposed to someone with COVID-19.
 - Announces the county has moved into the second tier of Phase 1A of its vaccination roadmap, which means doses are being distributed to caregivers with In Home Support Services (IHSS), intermediate care centers, and public and community health centers, including facilities for mental health.
