

# COVID-19 ADVISORY & GUIDANCE UPDATE

This update summarizes news, guidance, advisories, and legislative and executive actions taken by federal, state and local governments that impact San Bernardino County and its response to the Novel Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) crisis.

- **February 11** - The United States Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and Department of Defense (DOD) [purchased an additional 100 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines](#) from both Pfizer Inc. and Moderna Inc. to help meet the demand for COVID-19 vaccines in the United States. With the addition of these vaccines, the United States will have purchased a total of 600 million doses, which is enough to vaccinate 300 million people.
- **February 11**- The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) issued updated guidance on:
  - [Large gatherings](#), expressing attending large gatherings like Mardi Gras increases your risk of getting and spreading COVID-19.
  - Vaccinating [homebound persons](#) with COVID-19 vaccine.
- **February 11** - San Bernardino County (SBC) [announced](#) the:
  - SBC COVID-19 Hotline increased staff and expanded hours to assist County residents looking to schedule vaccination appointments. The hotline is now open from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m., Monday through Friday, at (909) 387-3911.
  - State streamlined the vaccination appointment system to allow individuals to immediately see if appointments are available.
  - Residents who have received a COVID-19 vaccine will still need to wear a mask and follow COVID-19 safety protocols in order to protect their families, friends and others who have not been vaccinated.
  - Victorville Transit Authority is offering free transportation for residents 65 and over to vaccination appointments at the Hook Community Center through the Vaccine Xpress Shuttle.
