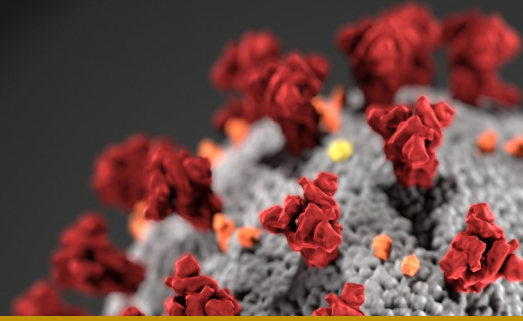


COVID-19 ADVISORY & GUIDANCE UPDATE

This update summarizes news, guidance, advisories, and legislative and executive actions taken by federal, state and local governments that impact San Bernardino County and its response to the Novel Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) crisis.

- **February 23-** The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has launched [VaccineFinder.org](https://www.vaccinefinder.org) which helps consumer find locations that offer COVID-19 vaccines and make an appointment. Guidance for vaccine providers includes public display checklists for:
