

COVID-19 ADVISORY & GUIDANCE UPDATE

This update summarizes news, guidance, advisories, and legislative and executive actions taken by federal, state and local governments that impact San Bernardino County and its response to the Novel Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) crisis.

- **March 11** - The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) released updated flowcharts on:
 - [COVID-19 Child Care Program Symptom Screenings](#) showing childcare staff what to do if a child in their care has symptoms of infectious illness.
 - [What to do if a student becomes sick or reports a new COVID-19 diagnosis at school.](#)
- **March 11** - The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), through the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) and CDC, [announced an additional 700 HRSA-supported health centers will be invited to join the Health Center COVID-19 Vaccine Program](#), increasing the total to 950.
- **March 11** - The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) updated [public health guidance](#) in the Blueprint for a Safer Economy to allow additional activities for a safe and sustainable reopening in breweries, wineries, distilleries, bars and overnight sleepaway camps.
- **March 11** - San Bernardino County [announced](#):
 - The arrival of over 12,000 doses of the recently approved single-dose Johnson & Johnson (J&J) vaccine.
 - Disabled and high-risk residents will become eligible to receive a COVID-19 vaccination starting next week.
 - El Sol Promotores is helping Spanish-speaking residents in the fight against COVID-19.
