This update summarizes news, guidance, advisories, and legislative and executive actions taken by federal, state and local governments that impact San Bernardino County and its response to the Novel Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) crisis.

- **April 16**– The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) issued:

- **April 16** - The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) [revoked emergency use authorization for monoclonal antibody bamlanivimab when administered alone.](#)
- **April 16** - The California Department of Public Health:
 - Announced that [50 percent of Californians aged 16 and older have received at least one COVID-19 dose.](#)
 - Issued All Facilities Letter ([AFL21-12](#)): Temporary waiver of practitioner’s order for administration of the COVID-19 vaccine.
- **April 16** - Governor Newsom signed legislation to create a [statewide policy for the rehiring of workers laid-off by the COVID-19 pandemic.](#)
- **April 15** - U.S. Department of Health & Human Services, Office of the Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response (ASPR) announced the [renewal of determination that a public health emergency exists as the result of the continued consequences of the COVID-19 pandemic.](#)
