Please be advised that **Lot #AZ220049** of AstraZeneca's Evusheld has expired as of August 31, 2022 and is not included in the shelf-life extension of Evusheld. AstraZeneca is currently accepting product returns only for expired product. To find out how to return product, please visit Evusheld.com.

REPORT WRONG DOSING FOR PAXLOVID

Paxlovid contains two different drugs that are co-packaged in daily blister card for oral use. Paxlovid is available in a standard dosage as well as a renal dosage for those with moderate renal impairment. Standard Paxlovid consists of 300 mg Nirmatrelvir; 100 mg Ritonavir. Please ensure you are prescribing and dispensing the medication with the appropriate configuration for your patients.
